The GOOD NEWS: the church was \$3,185 UNDER budgeted expenses for January! However, giving only met 89% of actual expenses. Please consider helping to "fill the budget gap" with a few extra dollars if you are able. Thanks for everyone's prayerful consideration in support of the wonderful missions that Immanuel is in charge of! Remember, contributions toward the Local Mission, or Immanuel's current expenses, help support basic expenses like heat, insurance, and snow removal, as well as paying the pastor and other staff and financing our Christian Education programs.

<u>Charitable Giving through Required Minimum Distributions</u> (RMDs)

For those of you that are over 70½ - and have an IRA – you're subject to a Required Minimum Distribution each year from that IRA – commonly referred to as your RMD. It's basically the IRS saying "you have to start taking money out of your IRA so we can

start collecting taxes on it." These RMD amounts are treated as taxable income to you, and you get a 1099R from your account custodian each year for the previous year's distribution.

However, thanks to a provision that was permanently passed into law a little more than a year ago you have the opportunity to turn your *taxable* required distribution into a *tax-free* distribution by what's known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). For the IRA distribution to be considered tax-free, the distribution check must be made payable directly to the charity (for example, Immanuel). The check itself doesn't have to be mailed directly to the church – you can have it mailed to your home and then you can deliver it personally. Or mail it yourself with a note – especially in the event you want those monies to be used for something specific here at Immanuel – like the building fund, JAM time, or youth group, etc.

It's a great way to give to the church, and a great way to save on your taxes! And with the increased standard deduction amount that's part of the new tax law starting in 2018, the ability to get additional tax savings by taking advantage of the QCD provision is HUGE for those of you 70½ and older. While the Finance Committee would like you to use this strategy for **gifting in addition** to what you already pledge to Immanuel, at the very least you should re-direct your future pledge dollars to come out of your RMD. That way you'll be helping Immanuel and saving on taxes at the same time! And perhaps you can use those tax savings to pledge even more. 

Ministry Mantras

Language for Cultivating Kingdom Culture

Currently your Immanuel Church Staff is doing a book study on **Ministry Mantras** by J.R. Briggs / Bob Hyatt. We'd like to share some of the insightful messages that we've gleaned from the book; after all, as our Journey Connection states, we are each considered Ministers of Immanuel and are all on a joyful journey – with Jesus – to disclose His presence in the world and His love for all people.

- ~ Structure Must Always Submit to Spirit Structures are important, but not as important as what the Spirit wants to do in, among and through you. Make the milk—not the container—the priority in your church.
- ~ Bet the Farm on Discipleship Discipleship is the "irreplaceable and lifelong task of becoming like Jesus by embodying His message. If the gospel is simply "say a prayer and you're all set", then there is no need for discipleship, but if the gospel is inviting people into the Way of Jesus to live into the values of the kingdom of God, then discipleship is absolutely essential to right living.
- **How Matters** Colossians 3:23: Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters.
- ~ Slay the Beast of Ambition Before It Slays You "It turns out that what you really think about Jesus is revealed by what you do after you find out that you don't have to do anything."
- ~ Come As You Are, But Don't Stay As You Are Make Room for Questions and Doubt, but Don't Make a Value out of Not Knowing A true missional community will be filled to the brim with people all over the place in their faith. Our job is to make room for them, their doubts and their questions, and appropriately challenge them to doubt their doubts and find the answers.
- ~ In a Family, Presence Is More Important Than Attendance We need one another in the body of Christ. With presence as a higher value than attendance, the focus remains on growing hearts more than on growing numbers.

- ~ If You're Not Hurt, Get off the Bench! This may not be your season to serve. If you come here hurt, burned out and in need of healing, just rest. But at a certain point, it's important to see the church not as simply for yourselves, but for others and for a broken and hurting world; and to find your role in creating the kind of community that you and hurt and broken people need.
- ~ This Community Will Be What You Make It − No matter who you are, or what your gifts might be, you play a vital role and bear ultimate responsibility for what the church does or fails to do.
- ~ Everything Is Formation Every choice we make, no matter how small or seemingly inconsequential, is actually another brick in our character formation, another piece of who we are becoming. Actions become habits; habits easily become character; character inevitably becomes destiny.
- ~ Few Things Mess with Your Theology More Than Reading Your Bible Mark Twain said, "It ain't the parts of the Bible that I can't understand that bother me, it's the parts that I do understand" And oftentimes, that's what messes with me the most.
- ~ **Disagree Without Disengaging** In the end, we believe that our best witness to the world is to be a community who can disagree in love and remain committed to one another not because our political or social views bind us together, but because the expansive and reconciling love of Jesus is at work in all of us.
- ~ Be Missionaries Cleverly Disguised as Good Neighbors When God's people are committed to God's mission for God's glory seven days a week, you've got a church full of missionaries.
- ~ Be a Pipe, Not a Bucket Bucket people tend to hoard what God has poured into them, they play it safe, refuse to take risks, and keep it all to themselves. Pipe people give of themselves freely. They share their time, resources, passions, gifts and experiences with others regularly. Let's us cultivate a community of pipes and celebrate when we see pipes working as pipes should! *Continued*...

- ~ Church Is Free, but It Ain't Cheap! While money isn't *the* driving concern of our community, it is part of the overall package of life together and even spiritual growth that we want to see for people as they take ownership of our church, which includes bills and obligations. Even beyond that, we believe that the gospel, in showing us clearly the generosity of God toward us, has the effect of making us into generous people.
- ~ The Tomb Is Empty-the Pressure's Off Be encouraged that at the end of the day you are not called to do great things *for* Jesus; you are called to be faithful as you are *with* God. Therefore, when we are anxious, stressed, discouraged, overwhelmed or worried, may we remember that the pressure is off because of what happened on Easter morning.

Do not be afraid. The pressure is off. The tomb is empty. And for that, we can be glad.

We hope some, if not all, of these "mantras" will speak to you in a way that will help guide you on your personal faith journey, and strengthen us as a community as we strive to cultivate a "Kingdom Culture" here at Immanuel Church.
