CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

JAM Time - Children's Ministry

JAM Time (Jesus and Me Time) is Immanuel's church school program for children ranging from age three through sixth grade. It is a Bible-based, action-packed, hands-on learning experience. Our goal is to keep lessons engaging, application-oriented, and relevant to a child's life. Children participate in JAM Time on Sunday mornings, September (Rally Day) through mid-May, from 10:30-11:30 a.m.



JAM Time follows the workshop rotational model -- each unit

provides four different ways to learn about the lesson. The Cuttin' and Strutting site is an arts and crafts center. Kickin' Kitchen is a food workshop. Movin' and Groovin' is a site that utilizes games and gross motor skills. Pleasin' Plots stimulates imagination and understanding through the use of drama and storytelling. Throughout the year, children participate in mini-units and special Sunday activities.

Beginning in September of 2018 the K4/K5 children have a self-contained classroom. This structural change has provided us the opportunity to differentiate the curriculum and provide a nurturing learning environment.

The theme for the 2016-2017 year was "Journey with Jesus." The current theme for the 2017-2018 year is "Journey is our Rock". Units presented from September through December included *Creation, Noah's Ark, and Advent-Angels.*

Highlights from the year include:

- JAM Time Celebration in May
- "Jesus is our Rock!" Rally Day
- Thanksgiving Sunday
- Christmas Eve Nativity Pageant

Our weekly offerings continue to support the children at Marshall Public School in India. This year's offering monies will be used to purchase benches for the Joyful Journey Marshal School.

The success of JAM Time is due to many factors. A stimulating curriculum is essential. The children are filled with enthusiasm and anticipation for each new week and workshop. The children have improved bible literacy due to the creative repetition of biblical concepts and stories. Content is learned in a multi-dimensional way. Children learn better and more deeply when more of their learning styles are applied. Approximately 35 children have grown in knowledge and spirit this year due to their participation in JAM Time.

It is the gifts of so many volunteers that make JAM Time possible. Site Leaders and Shepherds are needed for each unit. These individuals generously give of their time and talents throughout the year. The adult Site Leaders and Shepherds form strong bonds with the children as they work together to strengthen their relationships with Jesus Christ. It has been a blessing to work with this such a dedicated group of Christ followers!

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve the children and families of Immanuel Church.

HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP Elise Susnik, Director of Youth Ministries

Our youth group has grown to approximately 20 members, and this past June, nine of the youth went on another mission trip to Urban Immersion

in Minneapolis, MN. Emma Landowski ran the summer youth group activities in addition to her Sunday morning responsibilities while Pastor Rich was on Sabbatical, and the kids enjoyed a bonfire night and volleyball and put on a brat fry and car wash

Other activities included movie nights, game nights, a lock-in, serving at the Gala, helping with JAM Time, offering a babysitting night to parents, gathering supplies for Christian refugees around the world, and putting on an Easter Breakfast. Individual youth are serving in different roles within the church, including reading scripture, providing music, and serving communion, and most are doing some awesome service opportunities outside of youth group! Several of the youth continue to take advantage of "getting coffee" with Elise to get a little extra guidance and counseling on topics of personal interest or youth group curriculum.



FAITH LINK – CONFIRMATION Chris Arndt, Confirmation Leader

As I wrap up my first full year as the Confirmation leader I would like to say thank you to Immanuel for trusting in me to let me take this next step in the children's faith journey.

This year our curriculum was found from Sparkhouse called Reform. It was able to allow the children to take the teachings they learned in the past in Jam Time and express themselves by opening up dialogue on their thoughts and feelings about their faith.

I will be rotating the curriculum next year with talk sheets in order to provide the kids with a different perspective into their faith journey. This will allow this year's first year confirmands to experience something new and then in two years go back to the reform curriculum and keep it alternating on an every other year basis.

For confirmation, the second year confirmands have or will choose a topic that we went over this year in the Reform book and put it in their own words.

Our confirmation class this year consists of 2nd year Madison Schmitt, Brady Arndt, Harley Pieffle, Kendra Kapanke, Abby Fredrick and Joey Stier. Our 1st year is Evan Kaye, Aidan Kreis and Jatziel Papbon.

Confirmation is Sunday May 20 at the 9am service.

ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



Adult Education classes meet on Sundays at 10:30 AM

in the Education Room at Immanuel United Church of Christ.

In the Winter/Spring session of Adult Education at Immanuel United Church of Christ, the participants viewed Adam Hamilton's DVD "24 HOURS THAT CHANGED THE WORLD." Aimed at helping students better understand the events that occurred during the last twenty-four hours of Jesus' life, the video clarifies the significance of Christ's suffering and death, including the Last Supper, the Agony in the Garden, the Passion and Crucifixion. Class participants reflected upon and discussed the meaning of these events in their own lives.

During the Autumn session, we presented John Ortberg's video "SOUL KEEPING: Caring for the Most Important Part of You." Ortberg first establishes what the soul is, then reviews what the soul needs and, finally, suggests how the soul is restored. He also presents a compelling portrait of his friend and mentor, Christian philosopher Dallas Willard, and offers a practical interpretation of Willard's challenging concepts regarding the nature and operation of the human person. After viewing the video presentation, participants reflected on Ortberg's insights and shared how they might re-connect and deepen their relationship with God.



JOYFUL JOURNEYS, INC.

CIRCLE OF FRIENDS SHOPPE Sandy Luft

The Circle of Friends Shoppe is one of Immanuel's local ministries, serving families in and around the West Bend / Washington County area. We provide clothing, bedding, towels and small kitchen items to support individuals and families that find themselves with financially challenging life circumstances.

This year we served 473 individuals from 143 families. 253 were children. These people were referred to the Shoppe from 9 different human service agencies, including the local school district. It fills our hearts with gratitude when a mom's eyes whelm with tears of joy because she now has a coat to keep her child warm in the winter or seeing the excitement of a pregnant mother that is able to choose blankets, sheets and sleepers for her new baby.

None of this would be possible without the help of our many volunteers! Thank you to those that help with Stuff the Bus at Walmart in fall, purchase items for the Giving Tree and SHUMs Tree at Christmas, make monetary donations to buy underwear and socks, and last but not least, the 40+ volunteer sorters and Shoppe workers that give their precious time throughout the year.

Since the Shoppe opened in 2008, over 3,350 people have been helped in our community! Thank you Immanuel parishioners and friends!


PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

This ministry is a worldwide ecumenical movement of small groups of women who gather to pray and knit for those in need. Our handiwork is an expression not only of love and caring, but also of the loving care of the god who works through each of us.

This past year, in addition to creating prayer shawls for those in need, as well as for baptisms, we had the following projects.



Scarves were knitted for Immanuel graduates who were away at school.

Our "Winter Warmth" project was to knit hats and scarves that were taken to "Mr. Bob's Under the Bridge".

In February, we again participated in the American Heart Health month "Little Hats, Big Hearts" knitting tiny hats which were taken to St. Joseph's Hospital to be presented to all newborns in the month of February. This program is to raise awareness of congenital heart defects, the most common type of birth defect in the country.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR



2017 Treasurer's Report ~ Alan Olsen, Treasurer

Immanuel Local Mission expenses for 2017 totaled \$345,725.02, while income/giving totaled \$311,554.97. That is a shortfall of \$34,170.05. **Giving* met 90% of expenses**. However, giving was actually up by almost \$10,000 compared to 2016. The challenge was that our expenses last year were higher for a variety of reasons (snow removal, sabbatical worship costs, and overtime due to Jenny's expanded role and responsibilities). We finished 2017 with expenses approximately \$13,000 over budget – breaking a trend over the past few years of holding our expenses below our budgeted amounts. However, I'm happy to say that the early trend so far in 2018 is that we're back on track in keeping the expenses below budget!

*includes \$3,672 of 2016 giving prepaid for 2017.

The \$34,170.05 budget shortfall was offset by transfers from the Joyful Journey Endowment Fund during 2017 totaling \$30,507.73. Plus, the Local Mission checking account balance at the end of 2016 was \$2,051.84 and was carried into the new 2017 fiscal year. In the end we still had a deficit even after the transfers of \$3,662.32. By December 31, 2017 the balance in the Local Mission checking account was down to \$296.27. However, after the offerings on the first Sunday of the year were deposited the Local Mission checking account balance showed a balance of \$2,852.51 on January 9th.

On January 1, 2017 the *net* Joyful Journey Endowment Fund (JJEF) balance was \$47,405.16. As of December 31, 2017 the *net* JJEF balance was \$21,550.86, a reduction over the calendar year of \$25,854.30. The primary reason for the lower year-over-year balance is because there were *net withdrawals* from JJEF in 2017 totaling **\$31,015.45**. This amount is broken down and detailed in the bullet points below. The reason the net JJEF year-end balance wasn't less, despite the withdrawals during the year, was due to investment appreciation during the year of \$5,161.15. The dollar-weighted investment return for 2017 was 15.56%. (The JJEF account also holds the money market fund for the Special Projects Fund – currently with a balance of \$1,052.33. Those monies are *not* included in the net JJEF totals).

The 2017 JJEF withdrawal/deposit transactions were as follows:

- Per JJEF policy the dividend and interest earnings of **\$1,015.45** that accrued during **2016** were split equally, *withdrawn and deposited* to the Special Projects Fund and Local Mission checking on January 11, 2017.
- *Withdrawal of \$10,000* on April 11th to cover a shortage in the Local Mission checking. This transfer was the remaining \$10,000 of the \$20,000 that was originally approved for withdrawal by the congregation back on December 6, 2015.
- *Withdrawal of \$10,000* on July 14th to cover a shortage in the Local Mission checking. This transfer was one half of the \$20,000 that was originally approved for withdrawal by the congregation back on November 13, 2016.
- *Withdrawal of \$10,000* on October 10th to cover a shortage in the Local Mission checking. This transfer was the remaining \$10,000 of the \$20,000 that was originally approved for withdrawal by the congregation back on November 13, 2016.

Incidentally, at our fall congregational meeting last November 12th we asked for, and were granted, permission to withdraw the remainder of the Endowment Fund to cover the growing deficit in the budget. We fully anticipated needing some of those monies before the end of the year, and very likely the remainder of it during the early part of 2018. However, as of this date we have yet to access any of those monies! Sincere *thanks* to those of you who have generously stepped up during this budget crunch and made additional gifts to the church!

Lastly, the JJEF also holds an \$84,000 2nd mortgage on the Vincent's residence at 700 Deer Ridge Drive in West Bend. This mortgage note was amended on January 13th, 2011 to reflect Consistory's desire to waive a set annual interest rate charge in lieu of a capital appreciation calculation formula contained in the amended mortgage note. It was amended again on August14th, 2012 to reflect the increase in mortgage loan amount from \$70,000 to \$84,000 to help finance a new roof and other improvements.
