Immanuel Church Welcomes Guest Speaker on Sunday, September 22nd Reverend Franz Rigert, Conference Minister



Franz Rigert has deep roots in Wisconsin having been raised in Delavan where his father served the Congregational United Church of Christ for over 30 years. Franz studied pre-law and religion at the University of Wisconsin Eau Claire where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1989 and received the Exceptional Leadership Award. He declined an invitation from UW Madison Law School when called by

the Holy Spirit to attend seminary. Franz graduated with a Master of Divinity degree from Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois, where he received the Distinguished Preaching Award. He was ordained in 1992.

Franz served as Associate Minister at Kingwood United Methodist Church in Buffalo Grove, Illinois before being called in 1995 to serve Pilgrim United Church of Christ in Grafton, Wisconsin. While at Pilgrim, Franz led 25 mission trips domestically and internationally. The congregation developed a partnership with an African-American Baptist church, sponsored a refugee resettlement family and participated in several Habitat for Humanity projects. Franz facilitated a local ecumenical group, fostered numerous interfaith conversations and participated in clergy support groups. Over the years, the congregation grew from 300 to over 700 active members. He led Pilgrim through a capital fundraising initiative and a major building expansion. Franz was on the Southeast Association Church and Ministry Team for six years, serving as the Chairperson for four years. He then served three terms on the Conference Board of Directors. In the fall of 2014 Franz was called to serve as the Wisconsin Conference Minister for the United Church of Christ.

His wife, Trinn, has taught Early Childhood Special Education in the Cedarburg School District for 24 years. They have two sons and a daughter: Mitchell, who works and resides in Tacoma, Washington, Jordan, a student at UW La Crosse, and Marianna, a student at UW Eau Claire. Franz enjoys hiking, traveling, music and nature.

A Word from Emma...

Greetings Immanuel Family,

I'm writing to give you an update on all the things I've had going on in the past couple of months in preparation for ordination. So far, I'm on track for next year!

From the end of May through the middle of August I did Clinical Pastoral Education



(CPE) at St. Louis University Hospital here in Missouri. While there, I worked on the Cardiac and Geriatric floor as a chaplain. Most of my time was visiting with patients and their families, while also getting experience working "on call" or "triage" shifts as the solo chaplain in the 350+ bed hospital. Part of the CPE experience also required "class time" where I worked with my cohort and supervisor on interpersonal skills, family systems, ministering from scars rather than wounds, being aware of diverse and cultural differences, among other things. This experience, a requirement for ordination, was so powerful that I will be applying to do a CPE yearlong (paid!) Residency after graduating from Seminary. I must have done something right there because they have already hired me on to work as a PRN Chaplain during the school year.

In June, I was able to attend the UCC General Synod in Milwaukee. Among participating in worship services, meetings, and networking with others in ministry, I was able to attend the Break the Silence informational workshop. This workshop focused on educating those attending about rape, sexual assault, and domestic violence, particularly within our country. Space was also created to theologically reflect on why we don't talk about sexuality in the church and how that can actually be harmful when you have victims, survivors, and/or perpetrators of rape, sexual assault, and domestic violence within our churches. After voting on Sunday, the Break the Silence resolution passed to support clergy and congregations with

support, resources, and a designated Sunday to provide space to grieve, heal, and process together in community.

After finishing with CPE in August, I left for Cleveland, OH where I participated in the *Member in Discernment (MID) Gathering*. Different from any of the other experiences this summer, I was able to meet other MID's from around the country who are in different parts of the journey towards ordination. I spent time meeting with people from the UCC national staff, as well as, attending workshops around alternative ministry options (chaplaincy), insurance and retirement in the UCC, and the "Marks of Ministry" ...preparation for ordination. The MID Gathering was really an informative and call affirming space to be a part of.

From Cleveland I flew to North Carolina where I spent 7 days for the *Next Generation* conference. The Wisconsin UCC conference has a partnership with the EkiR and EKBO in Germany, as does the Pennsylvania Central and Southern (eastern Virginia and North Carolina). All of the partners came together to discuss how we see racism, immigration, and climate change in our communities and the way the church is/should be responding. This was an extremally powerful week of challenging conversations, painful processing, and spirit filled calls to action. Many friendships have continued since the last time I was with this partnership in Germany two years ago and many new friendships were made. I look forward to learning and growing with and from them in the future.

Words cannot express how grateful I am for the love and support I have received from all of you. It is because of you that most of these things happened this summer. I started my last year of Seminary on Aug. 26th and I am excited and amazed at how far I have come. Please continue to keep me in your prayers and know that I love to receive letters from you all. Thank you again for all the different ways you show support, I look forward to the day when I can come back and be ordained! (For those that don't know, I will be ordained at Immanuel and then be installed into the place that has called me for ministry).

ATTENTION ALL KIDS 3RD GRADE AND OLDER!!

All children third grade or older are invited to become a member of the Acolyte Guild. Throughout the

year, these children provide worship leadership by lighting and extinguishing candles at the **9:00 a.m. worship service**, as well as candle lighting during Advent, on Christmas Eve, and on Maundy Thursday.

If you'd like to join the Acolyte Guild, or just want to see what it's all about, simply come to **one** of two upcoming **training sessions**. At the end of the session, if you decide to join, you will be put on the acolyte schedule beginning in October 2019.

Training sessions will be held on **September 15th and 22rd**, right after JAM Time and church, from **11:30 a.m. until 12:15 p.m.** in the sanctuary. At the session, children will learn the procedures to follow when serving as an acolyte. Veteran acolytes need only stay for a verbal review of the instructions, which will take approximately 15 to 20 minutes.

All children (including veteran guild members) who wish to acolyte <u>must</u> attend one of the training sessions.

<u>Remember</u> - Coming to training does not mean you have to become an acolyte. It's an opportunity to learn what an acolyte does and to practice doing it. Then you can decide if you want to join for 2019-2020.

It will be extremely helpful if you check your family calendar between October 2019 and September 2020. When you come to training, please bring a list of any Sundays and Christmas season services when you are unable to acolyte. Those dates will be taken into consideration when the schedule is made.

Our first event in August was Wacky Games at Church. We had a water balloon toss, egg races, musical chairs and so much more.



INDIA NEWS

As we look to the 2019 Gala as a way to support Immanuel's India Minsitry, our focus this year is "celbrating how far we've come and maintaining the good works that are being done"!

Our history "in a nutshell"...

In 2005, Immanuel Church, as a whole, agreed to financially support Novahu Valluri and his family as they began their mission of ministering and educating the poorest of the poor in the village of Madhavapatnam...we began with a one room school house, 5 students and the desire to shine the light of Christ in this area. Within 1 year, enrollment was up to 35 children... Shortly after that first year, Joyful Journeys, Incorporated, a 501(c)3 organization was established by Immanuel Church as a way to help support and sustain the growth of our church's ministry.





Other ministries that started early on were the Cutting & Tailoring Centers teaching women a trade, Joful Journey Hostel for orphans, and a Lunch Bunch program to feed hungry students.







The first of many major expansions within the ministry was the purchase of a building to accomodate Marshall School and the now 60 students enrolled. This structure was bought for \$6,000 by Immanuel Church. The second expansion, also made that year, was the purchase of a building to house Novahu and his family as well as serve as the JJ Hostel. Members of Immanuel raised \$13,000 for that purchase.





Over the next several years through the continued generosity of our Immanuel Church family and friends, additions were made to Marshall School to accommodate the ever growing number of students. A larger home was built for the Valluri family and hostel children, with the main floor being utilized for the Cutting and Tailoring program, school assemblies and weekly worship.





In 2014, through personal support and fundraising at Immaneul Church, Terri's Dining Hall was built, providing an area for students and hostel children to eat, and Bill's Light Center for Computer Training was constructed offering both students and adults a space to learn technilogical skills.





That same year, through the combined efforts of Immanuel Church along with the Kakinada and West Bend Rotary Clubs, Lora's Living Water, a water filtration system, was installed serving students and community members clean drinking water.





Other ministries that Joyful Jouneys maintains are the House Pastor program which equips and supports individuals in sharing the Gospel within neighboring villages, and Oma's Oldsters, a fund that offers assistance with neccesities to seniors in the community.







With money raised through Immanuel's Annual India Galas, the latest additions to the Marshall School were added in 2017 offering space for a science lab, a library and the 450 students that attend there. The Landowgals Fashion Technology and Computer Training Institute was also completed; this new structure gives impoverished women a place to come to learn skills and build self confidence.
