Clarinet stop for our Gluck Opus 19 Organ

With gifts from Norene Lowers' memorial, a fund for the purchase of a clarinet stop for our Gluck Opus 19 Organ was started in March 2017. In order to keep the price of the new organ as low as possible, Sebastian Gluck did not include the \$11,000 clarinet in his original proposal. His hope was that at a future date the church would have the funds and make the decision to complete the instrument by the addition of the 8' Clarinet stop.

Recently, our organist, Marlene Wondergem, checked with Sebastian Gluck, the designer and builder of our organ, on the current purchase price of a clarinet rank. She learned he would offer the generous purchase price of \$11,088, only \$88 more than the price quoted in 2014. By word of mouth, generous donations have recently been contributed to the clarinet fund first started with Norene Lowers' memorial, so much so, that funds are now available to purchase, ship, and install the pipes and racks and all else needed in the organ chamber. Installation is expected to take two to three days and to be completed by Christmas.

Isn't it Grand?

Through the generosity of Dr. Richard and Carolyn Gibson, a beautiful cherry wood 5'4" Boston Grand Piano has been given to Immanuel for use in the music ministry of our congregation. The warmth of its lovely tone will enhance piano accompaniments for our choirs, as well as for vocalists and instrumentalists in their Ministries of Music.

Thank you, Richard and Carolyn, for donating this amazing gift that will bless the Lord and his people for years to come!

Immanuel UCC ~ 2019 Missional Budget Update

Your church leadership has constructed a bold plan of ministry to continue our mission of being and making Spirit-filled followers of Christ who shine the light of God's love to the world. We celebrate a wonderful past year and commit ourselves to bringing even more lives to God's love in the coming year! Join us in this journey of being God's people in West Bend, Wisconsin.

In 2019, Immanuel United Church of Christ has been faithfully investing in its mission "To be and to make Spirit-filled followers of Christ who shine the light of God's love to the world." The financial cost of this endeavor through August, 2019 (\$241,566) is summarized here:

- \$110,208 to provide meaningful, life-changing worship
- \$72,337 to nurture persons in their faith journey
- \$59,021 to witness to our faith in service beyond ourselves

Some highlights of these ministries include:

- Encouraging living a Christ-centered life through regular and focused worship services
- Monthly celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Communion
- Warm and welcoming fellowship time between Sunday morning services
- Rally "Sundae" Celebration at the beginning of September to kick off the various Christian Education opportunities, including JAM (Jesus and Me) Time, Confirmation, "Shine" High School Group, and Adult Education Classes
- Meaningful music during worship services
- Benevolence funds and counseling given to members and non-members in need
- Supporting the growth of the Joyful Journeys Ministry in India and at the Circle of Friends Shoppe

Immanuel consistently operates below budget, which is great news! However, year-to-date giving has met only 87% of expenses, and therefore the remaining \$12,141 in the Journey Endowment Fund was transferred to Immanuel in August to help bridge the gap.

Please consider how you have been touched by the furthering of Immanuel's missions, and pray for continued support of these endeavors, for the remainder of 2019, and also looking forward to 2020.

Pledge cards 2020, which were mailed in late September, will be collected on October 20. Costs to support our various missions continue to rise each year. Are you "growing in the grace of giving?"

The Annual Congregational Budget meeting will be on November 24 after second service.

Update on Certain Fund Balances:

Immanuel continues to collect funds for various specific projects, such as the Building Fund. We thank everyone who has contributed to the following funds:

- Clarinet Fund the final piece of the organ will be installed as soon as one can be obtained! The Clarinet Fund has been building since the organ was installed, and as of late, a few significant contributions were received to reach the amount needed for this project. The fund will remain open and renamed to "Chancel Music Fund" to be used for things that are related to the Music Ministry of Immanuel, above and beyond regular expenses.
- Kitchen Fund the Goodie Gals and the India Gala Food Prep Team have expressed the need for a updated kitchen stove and refrigerator/commercial cooler. The Kitchen Fund was established for these improvements. Currently, we have almost \$5,000. If you are moved to contribute toward the Kitchen needs, please designate "Kitchen Fund" on your donation.
- Building Fund The Building Fund continues to grow steadily. The parking lot will use nearly half of the \$22,000 in the fund. The Property Committee will be discussing the next priority after that project is finished.

Once again, there is great need throughout the world for **care** and **hope!** Our Operation Christmas Child boxes fulfill some of that need. Along with the boxes' contents, personnel from Samaritan's Purse deliver the message of Christ's love and forgiveness to people all over the globe.

Boxes and information are in the narthex, so that we can try once again to surpass our goal and deliver over 50 boxes during the week of **November 17th. The cost of shipping is \$9/box**.

There are three different ways from which to choose to help get these boxes to the children:

- **1. Pack your own box.** If you plan to include a check to cover the shipping with your box, you should write the *check payable to Samaritan's Purse*, with OCC boxes in the memo blank.
- **2.** Help pay for the shipping of a box that someone else has packed. If you would rather not shop and pack a box, your donation to the shipping of others' boxes would be greatly appreciated. You may write a check to Immanuel United Church of Christ, and in the memo section designate the money to the Operation Christmas Child fund.
- **3.** Pack your own box and go online to purchase your mailing label. If you *make your donation online*, you can Follow Your Box and receive a special label. Attach the label to your shoebox and use the Look-up Tool to find out the country where your box will be delivered. **Go to:** samaritanspurse.org/operation-christmas-child/follow-your-box

Finally, knowing what NOT to include in the boxes is important, as these items will be removed before shipping. *This has changed from past years.*

Do Not Include

Candy; toothpaste; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
