The Story of a Clarinet Stop

In 2014 our Immanuel church family celebrated the purchase of a new pipe organ, the Gluck Opus 19. This beautiful instrument was designed by Sebastian Gluck of the Gluck Pipe Organs for the purpose of enhancing the worship of God here at Immanuel United Church of Christ.

The organ is serving us well. Congregational singing is hearty and heart-felt. Your organist appreciates the variety of registrations available for service music as she prepares the preludes and offertories and postludes. However, she has always been aware



that Sebastian Gluck saw one piece missing, and that was the clarinet stop, an additional tone color to expand the musical possibilities of this instrument.

Our organ builder, Sebastian Gluck, had hoped to include this additional reed in the organ. However, to keep the cost down, \$11,000 was saved by not including the clarinet. He did, however, reserve space in the organ chamber for this rank of pipes, with the hope that at a future date, funds would be available to complete the organ as he designed it. With donations from the memorial of Lorene Lowers, herself a one-time clarinetist, a fund for the purchase of a clarinet stop was started in March 2017.

Through the generosity of a few individuals who learned of this missing piece, the necessary funds became available to purchase this rank of pipes. Sebastian Gluck generously gave us a purchase price of \$11,088, only slightly more than the cost quoted in 2014. On February 12 and 13, 2020, installation of the clarinet pipes in the organ chamber was completed. Our organ consultant, Scott Riedel, helped secure the Swartz Organ Company, a builder from Georgia who is presently working in this area, to do the installation.

With the recent addition of the clarinet stop, the Gluck Opus 19 is now the complete artistic piece as originally designed, and this instrument will continue to inspire our worship as we praise the Lord together.



INDIA NEWS

On February 16th, many of the team members from the group that recently traveled to India shared their reflections on the trip as well as their thoughts on how Joyful Journeys Ministry is touching the village of Madhavapatnam and beyond. What a blessing it was to hear how lives are being changed both in India and here at Immanuel! Below is the moving testimony by traveler Jan Armato. May God continue to work in and through Joyful Journeys Ministry.

India: The Kingdom of Heaven Written by 2020 India Traveler Jan Armato

My first impression of India was that it is a country of contrasts. Emerald green rice paddies and stately palms intermingle with crowded dusty roads and squalid huts. Somehow I sensed that to fully embrace this country meant holding everything at once: the colorful and the drab, the purity and the pollution. I was surprised by how easy it seemed. For the first few days, I was enchanted. Returning from our last house church visit, however, my enchantment was challenged.

In the middle of a stony vacant lot sat a small child wearing nothing but a dingy white t-shirt. Surrounded by a neighborhood of empty buildings, she squatted alone, rocking - her head in her hands. I blinked and the vision was gone. But its shadow had taken root, coiling around my heart like a cobra.

Our bus returned us to our hotel and we retired for the evening. Around two in the morning, the cobra struck. I woke, sobbing. *Continued*...

I thought I understood poverty. Inequity - a fact of life. I know the poor lack options and that my choices, my consumption affects the rest of the world. But this was different. The poverty I saw in that lot was beyond hunger and thirst, beyond sickness, even beyond abuse. It was the poverty of loneliness...and beyond that: despair.

Matthew (5:3) calls it "poor in spirit." Between tears, I Googled the beatitudes and found that only two are in the present tense, declaring them to actually BE the kingdom of heaven. This was one. I could not fathom how what I had seen could possibly be so. Suddenly, in the dark, I saw the image of that child in everyone: my teammates, shopkeepers, people in the street, our hosts and their family members. Their faces came flooding into me like the house church villagers who swarmed after service wanting us to bless them. And I understood that the opposite of despair is not "hope." It is "communion."

Gradually the image dissolved into a white shadow, like a candle, that I saw, *still* see over everyone's heart. *(Our Christmas candlelight service came to mind and it will never be the same for me again.)* And I began to understand that the loneliness I see in each of us is a gift propelling us toward one another. It is the soil of "the kingdom of heaven" from which seeds of community sprout and bloom. And this is what the *Joyful Journey Hostel* is about: offering the lost and alone, a home.

More than once I overheard children say how grateful they were for all the hostel offered them. It was never limited to basic needs. Before all else, they would declare their thanks for being part of a family. And because of our commitment and participation, they are part of *Immanuel's* family and we theirs.




On our walks down the streets of

Madhavapatnam, neighbors shared a wordless one-handed greeting with us. For me, it is an acknowledgment not only of the divine within each of us but also an expression of gratitude for the gift of loneliness that connects us all: *Namaste*.
