# Thoughts from our Church Treasurer & Financial Secretary



There is no question that these are unprecedented times that we are experiencing. We see panic and we see fear arising and playing out in so many forms. So what does this mean to us and our church family? This means that our faith and witness is more important than ever. Our church family needs prayer,

support, and assistance in more ways than normal.

We realize that our church is diverse and will feel the impact of our rapidly changing situation in different ways. Some of us are giving up long awaited vacations or gatherings. Some of us are scrambling desperately to find childcare while schools are shut down because we still must report to work. Some of us are facing the hardship of not knowing when we will see our next paycheck. Some of us live in fear of contracting a virus that has so many unknowns and could have a severe impact due to existing health issues that compromise us. Some of us are feeling like the world has gone insane. No matter where you come from it does not change that you are God's. As Pastor Rich put so well at our last service, we were just reminded of this on Ash Wednesday when our response as the ashes were being place on our foreheads was "In life and in death I belong to God".

# So how do we show that we are God's in a world that is so rapidly changing? How do we find a new way of doing things?


# Something to think about...

# Health update from Pastor Rich

This last Sunday, March 15<sup>th</sup>, I was finally able to give an update on my current health situation during both worship services. Knowing that not all were able to attend these services because of coronavirus concerns, I offer the following synopsis:



I have been diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome. This disorder disrupts the production of my white blood cells, so that I have about one-third of the normal count. According to my doctor, if I do nothing, I have a 50% chance of developing Acute Leukemia in the next three years. This percentage increases with time.


At the recommendation of my Doctor I am currently pursuing a Bone Marrow Transplant. There are risks to this surgery, but if it works, I could be completely cured of the Myelodysplastic Syndrome. The Transplant process would take anywhere between 1 - 3 months, depending on my body's response.

Currently, my doctor is looking for a donor. My sister and my children over 18 (Carmen, Owen) are considered first as possible candidates. If they are not a match, then we move to the "Bone Marrow Donor Bank" for possible candidates. This process alone could take some time. Meanwhile, I'll have my blood checked again in May. If my white cell count remains stable, I will forego surgery until January or June of 2021. Obviously, if my white cell count takes a dive, surgery would be sooner.

All in all, I'm in good spirits. I am grateful for the loving support, prayers, and concern of many within this congregation and beyond. I will keep you updated as progress continues. Grace and peace to you!

# **Update on Immanuel Church's Lower Level**

Our Property Guys have been working closely with Albiero Plumbing and Spectrum Services in the ongoing effort to resolve our flooding issues. After extensive digging, it was found that a Charter/Spectrum fiber cable penetrated our storm drain. Because of this, our pipe was clogged with debris and sediment making it nearly impossible for rainwater to flow away from our building.

A new pipe was installed, and the hole has been filled back in.

We are not 100% sure yet that this repair will rectify our problem, but as of the rainstorm on March 19<sup>th</sup>, the floor remains dry. We hope this is the answer to our prayers but keep praying just in case!!

Our India situation also very pathetic due to corona virus! No international flights coming to India and going out from India and schools are closed for at least 10 days. RED alert was declared till 31st of March so all community festivals are cancelled and elections in India are postponed. I do not know what the future of the Corona effect is on this country. Even though we gave holidays to school, we cannot send the children to out because of Corona. Our hostel children watch movies and stay in the orphanage praying and studying. It is much harder on the children who live in small homes and huts because they should not come out. Some examinations are postponed. Our students in 10th grade are scheduled to take their graduating examinations beginning from March 31st to April 17th. Please keep us all in your prayers.

We are praying for all our friends at Immanuel church, West Bend. Please take care your health and protect yourselves from this deadly virus. Karishma and Shekinah were also sent home by their college due to Corona virus. They brought preventive homeopathic medicine with them and gave to all of us, family members and orphans too.

We are safe now. Please continue to pray for our India, we also are praying for USA.
