A note from Pastor Rich. . .

Greetings members and friends of Immanuel UCC. In the midst of a very difficult time, I remain overjoyed and encouraged by your loving support, kind words, and empowering actions. I have no news on the health front since



my next blood draw is mid-July, but I do have a hopefully encouraging and helpful word about our present situation.

As one who desires to take our faith seriously and "live into" the sacred story we have been given, I have been searching for the "right" story through which to understand and interpret our present situation. And thankfully, through the writings of N. T. Wright, I have found what I think is the perfect biblical metaphor for what we've been (and continue to be) going through – "exile".

Centuries before Christ, God's people were taken into captivity to Babylon. In this move against their will, they lost everything they found familiar, comfortable, and important. They lost access to the Temple, the priesthood, sacred rituals and worship. All that they valued was lost. Life as they once knew it was completely changed. But in spite of all this, they never lost God. God went with them into exile and told the exiled community (through the prophets) that they must make the best of the present situation, not live in regret or anger, but rather, pray for the welfare of those around them, and continue to live faithfully, with full awareness that, one day, God would once again deliver them. The years of exile were hard. Many refused to listen to the prophets and lost their faith or gave into despair.

We are in a similar situation – in exile from all we once found familiar, comfortable, and important. This strange new environment can be overwhelming and upsetting. Yet, rest assured: Just as the prophets of old pronounced, God remains faithful. God is with us in exile. God continues to bless us – yet in new, different ways. And one day, we will be released from exile. So, in the present, our call is to endure, and remain faithful and hopeful. At such a (strange) time as this, I am grateful to be your pastor. I am grateful to be able to proclaim good news even in hard times. I am grateful that the gospel we believe and share isn't limited to only "working" in convenient, comfortable times, but is also equally relevant in challenging times. We will get through this and we will one day speak of the God who remains faithful even in difficult times. God be with you all, my faithful and beloved flock!

A word from our President...

During these uncertain times I bring your greeting from Immanuel's leadership team. From the beginning of June, leadership has been deliberating the issue of restarting some form of corporate worship in our sanctuary. It is a decision with many viewpoints all along the spectrum of should we or should we not re-enter into sanctuary worship. Speaking to these viewpoints, many protocols as to how it should be done have been developed. These and various writings from the UCC national conference, state conference and



other organizations have been reviewed and debated during our meetings. Protocols were drafted and reworked during our deliberations.

After all these efforts to structure a re-entry to corporate worship the question remains: Is it worth the risk and effort to bring forth worship in such a drastically altered format that it may please none and endangers some of our members?

We know worship would look very much like what is seen now at every Sunday and Wednesday service as presented on You Tube. We could accommodate few members, offer a stripped down highly structured service with no singing, and offer no time for fellowship. More importantly we may be running the risk of endangering not only our beloved pastor due to his currently compromised immune system, but others in the congregation as well. Members may be able to make the decision to stay away until it is safe, but the pastor has to be present. This is an issue that leadership will continue to deliberate over the next months. As more information and data becomes available our informed decisions will continue to evolve.

Please continue to pray for Immanuel and its leadership as it continues to lead toward a re-entry to worship. I can only wish you the peace of Christ as we move through these uncertain times.

Galatians 5:22-23



Faith in Christ is a gift of God, and the work of his Spirit. In Galatians 5:22-23, Jesus names the Fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. When we practice the Fruits of the Spirit we learn to abide in the unchanging self of God. Our confidence grows as we learn how to apply these gifts to our daily lives.

As a reminder of the Fruits of the Spirit, peek at our resident Immanuel Duck family below. Each duckling is named after a Fruit of the Spirit. Mama Duck has something in common with us, choosing Immanuel as our "home".





I encourage JAM Time families to revisit the Galatians scripture passage and discuss the Fruits of the Spirit. Share how the Fruits of the Spirit are at work. They are a good reminder for ALL of us.

Love: An overwhelming feeling or sense of commitment to a person or God. Love involves actions that go beyond kindness, that often involve self-sacrifice and doing things we do not want to.

Joy: A happy feeling about something God did or created.

Peace: Solving arguments instead of getting all upset.

Patience: Waiting for God's timing.

Kindness: An action that shows love or understanding toward others.

Goodness: Sticking to God's ways, especially when others are not.

Faithfulness: Showing you love God in front of others.

Gentleness: Treating others gently.

Self-Control: Showing discipline, especially when frustrated or angry.

Reading God's Word produces good fruit in our lives over time, by the grace of God. 2 Timothy 3:16 says, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness...."

In Psalm 19 we see that it refreshes the soul, makes wise the simple, gives joy to the heart, and gives light to the eyes. These are just a few of the promises about the work of God's Word in believers'-including even young children's-lives.

This past month, Circle of Friends Volunteers who work at the Shoppe and sort clothes gathered to discuss the thought of reopening our ministry. It was decided that we would resume collecting items for the Shoppe and begin serving customers on June 17th. Specific policies have been implemented so that we can safely continue to serve our community during the Coronavirus. Certainly, the wellbeing of our staff as well as those we provide for is of utmost importance as we move forward in our mission:

To establish and or operate programs and facilities that will assist impoverished and needy people whose lives are challenged by current life circumstances, by helping to provide for their immediate basic needs and to bring them hope and promise for a brighter future.

We were happy to serve 9 families, equating to 21 people on our first night open!

Joyful Journeys India ~ COVID-19 Relief Fund ~

Praise God, for the outpouring of support for our JJI~CRF! Through the generous donations from member of our Immanuel Church Family as well as friends of Joyful Journeys Ministries, we've been able to stay on top of the desperate nutritional and hygiene needs arising in the village of Madhavapatnam due to the Coronavirus and also begin to make structural changes within the Marshall School and Joyful Journey Hostel as we begin to consider welcoming students back later this summer.

In the meantime, since school in India started at the beginning of June, we are looking at ways to facilitate learning with technology. The Indian Government recently began supplying families with devices so children could learn at home, we are now looking to purchase laptops for our teachers so that they can connect with their students virtually. Some of the teachers are able to come into the school and use the computers there, however there isn't enough for all of them. Our hope is to purchase 4 laptops, each costing \$537, as soon as possible so they don't fall behind with their studies.

Please continue to keep this ministry in your prayers as we move forward into unchartered territories.
