Thoughts from our Pastoral Assistant/Director of Ministries

As I'm writing this, Thanksgiving is only a couple days away and in spite of everything we are facing in our personal lives and in our greater world, I am finding it easy to count my bountiful blessings. All the obvious reasons to give thanks set aside, I'd like to focus on my gratitude in serving alongside such an amazing church family as in YOU! Let me try and explain why...

So much of what we are hearing in the news focuses on the importance of wearing masks and refraining from large gatherings. There has been great importance put on thinking beyond your own personal needs and wants. Although some may be saying, "why wear a mask, I'm young, I'll survive?" or "why respect social distancing, I'm healthy, I'll pull through?", most support these moral responsibilities for the common good of those they love as well as those they may not even know, even if they feel it is of no benefit to themselves.

This concept of basing your actions on others, opposed to strictly thinking of yourself can also be thought about in regard to supporting your church. Many could be asking similar questions such as "Why continue to support Immanuel when I can't gather for in person Worship?" "Why contribute to various ministries when I currently feel so far removed from them?" I can see where that could be an easy path to slide into.

But here is where I tell you why I'm so thankful for you, my Immanuel Church Family... Since COVID began nine months ago, many of you have continued to give regularly out of your sheer commitment to our church. And why is that so important? Our congregation has lost 5 beloved members within a months' time; imagine how these families would have felt if they were told their loved one's church was closed due to lack of funding and could offer no pastoral support. Assistance has been given to members and friends who have found themselves in financial hardship because of the coronavirus; I shudder to think what would become of them without our Benevolence Fund. Homebound members have stayed connected and appreciated treasured JAM Time gifts because our ministries and faithful individuals continue to serve; my heart aches to think anyone would be feeling forgotten during these dark times. Needy families are still receiving clothing, etc. because our Circle of Friends Shoppe is being kept open; certainly, it would have to shut down if we couldn't afford to heat the house and there was no one to staff the program. Hundreds of people in India are

being supported and cared for through our Joyful Journeys Ministry~COVID Relief Fund on top of maintaining the mission work being done in Madhavapatnam over the past 15 years; the struggles they have faced during this world wide pandemic are greater than we are capable of wrapping our minds around, without this extra assistance, devastation would have consumed this community. Numerous outside organizations, as well as some of our own groups, are finding it possible to host small gatherings thanks to our open doors; if we couldn't pay our bills, our space and technology would be useless. And a number higher than any of you can imagine have found comfort within Immanuel's building whether they are seeking solace in our sanctuary or a listening ear and a prayer in our offices; our church is alive because it is regularly being fueled by your generosity. Chances are, many of you don't fall into any of these categories, and you should thank the Lord Jesus you don't. But for those who have, it is because of so many of you who have, in spite of your own personal needs, continued to show love and kindness to others through giving to Immanuel and its ministries. In other words, you've thought beyond yourself in support of the common good of those you love as well as those you may not even know. And this, dear friends, is why I am so grateful for YOU!!

By the time you read this, Thanksgiving 2020 will be behind you; my sincere hope is that you were able to look beyond any despair based on current circumstances and find all your reasons to give thanks. I also pray that as we begin our journey through Advent, that you make time to prepare your heart for the coming of the Christ Child, because that may be the only thing we can be sure of this Christmas.

These blessings would include:

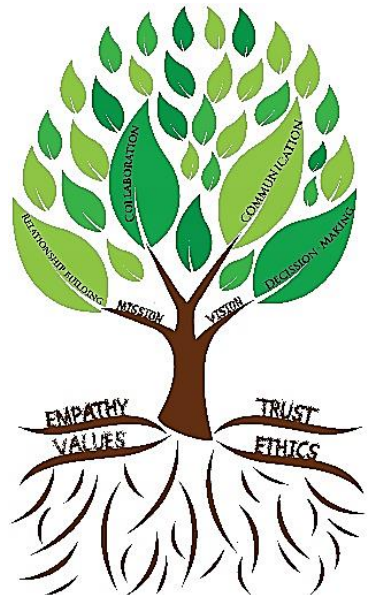
1. A church which continues to function and bring support to its members

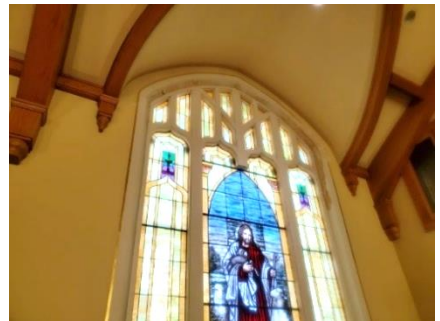

Property Updates

Tuck pointing work has been completed on the Northeast side of the building to save our stain glass window that was at risk. A few additional issues were discovered during the repair which added a little extra to our original estimate but were necessary. Now with the repair complete to save the window, we need to focus on repair to the damage that was already done. The first repair we need is to the plaster and we have an estimate of \$9,200 to do so. Once that is complete, we will be looking into the painting that would be needed as well. If you feel called to do so a contribution to help cover the costs of these repairs would be greatly appreciated to maintain the beauty and integrity of our building.

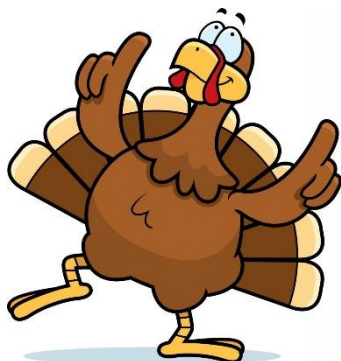
