

An update from Immanuel's Lay Leadership




JAM Time Activity

generously preparing each kit.































J.A.M. Time Family Resources...

Letter from Novahu...

Greetings Immanuel Church! I greet you in the precious name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

I want to thank you and Joyful Journeys Inc. for supporting and supplying all the needs of Joyful Journeys in India, I appreciate your continued help in our efforts to care for the needy in our community. Here I would like to acknowledge and say a word of thanks for the money that you provided to meet the needs of the school and the hostel along with COVID issues.

In addition to sending monthly pledge so that we could continue to pay our teachers and staff, house pastors, and provide for our hostel children, you have supported us on so much more...

Your contributions to Joyful Journeys COVID Relief Fund enabled us to supply food, hygiene items and basic necessities when our village of Madhavapatnam and beyond were in desperate need. We were able to offer support to our House Pastors and give them provisions for their congregations. Hand sanitizer stands and thermometers were purchased for at the school and hostel. PPE items were purchased for all our staff. Four laptops were purchased which was a great help during this time when students were not coming to schools and teachers could not got to their homes. And through all this many came to see the grace of Jesus through Joyful Journeys Ministry unconditional love.

Over the last nine months, when our expenses weren't normal, we managed the budgeted money you sent to help with much needed repairs and upkeep on our buildings such as painting, general maintenance, cement and plaster work, and plumbing repairs caused by rats in our bathroom and kitchen drainage system. We were able to purchase two modems, one for at the hostel and the other for the school, now we have good net connection. New generators were installed to help supply more power to our school, computer center and church. This was all very helpful for us, but it also allowed us to offer our space, while the school was not

operating at full capacity, to our Government Officials for them to use for conducting their competitive examinations.

I'm so much thankful for the Christmas money too. Even though in this season of COVID-19 and churches not gathering, still our Immanuel church is so gracious to send Christmas money and gifts to all our staff members, teachers, students, oldies, pastors, and village scavengers.

On this occasion I take this opportunity to say a words of thanks from the bottom of our hearts (me, Manjula, Karishma and Shekinah).

On this occasion at the start of a New Year, I thank God the way that he connected us with Immanuel church and all the friends that are connected to Immanuel church. Bible says Psalms 103: 1-2, Bless the Lord O my soul, and forget not all his benefits...

Friends, may all your homes be filled with laughter and happiness.

Dear Immanuel UCC,

In the aftermath of yesterday's mob activity in Washington DC, many of us are feeling sorrow, shock and shame. We wonder anxiously if our society is teetering on a dangerous edge. Together we are alarmed by the threat to legislators in session, and we are infuriated by such violence perpetrated on the very grounds of our Capital. We grieve the damage, desecration, injuries and deaths resulting from a destructive demonstration that turned into an ugly insurrection. Thankfully, last evening, order was restored while the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives resumed their business, tempered their objections, ratified the Electoral College results and resolutely moved us toward a peaceful transfer of presidential power.

As people of faith, we condemn such violence and we call upon the highest leaders of our land to uphold the democratic principles and constitutional integrity of our government. As people of faith, we also acknowledge that words matter, and that political (and religious) leaders of every persuasion have particular responsibilities never to incite violence and never to promote anarchy. Leaders who fail to live up to these high standards share culpability for such tragic events and ought to be held accountable.

Many have raised questions about tolerance levels afforded to predominantly white protestors, especially in the wake of hundreds of racial justice rallies this past summer. This is yet another dimension to our confession and understanding of white privilege, and an example of the systemic bigotry that yet exists in our country. Over a half century ago, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. taught us about pursuing justice through non-violent expressions. In the midst of yesterday's melee we witnessed a sweet irony . . . the Rev. Raphael Warnock, who serves as prophetic preacher in King's former pulpit at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, was elected to the United States Senate!

And, amidst all of yesterday's political tumult, Christians celebrated Epiphany – the day ending Christmastide when we recognize our spiritual calling to share the light and love of Jesus Christ with the world. Today, we may feel sadness, but we can encourage each other to make some bold faith choices. We can choose kindness, forgiveness and grace. We can choose to work for personal healing and societal justice. We can choose to look for beauty in the eyes of strangers and foster peace in small neighborly ways. We can choose to exemplify the life of Christ through random acts of compassion and – despite all despair – place our hope in the God of love who remains our strength and shield!

Let us – in this Uniting Church of Christ – come together around these convictions and offer our deepest prayers for a nation in turmoil, and for ALL her people!
