An update from Immanuel's Lay Leadership

Greetings from Immanuel's leadership team. Hopefully, we all feel the joy as the days grow longer and the sun shines more. It means we are on the seasonal upswing toward the spring equinox when new life is once again on its way. Beyond the seasonal picture, we are beginning to see more and more vaccines being administered. While we may feel there is not enough, it is not arriving fast enough, the distribution is not up to our expectations and the priorities are wrong; we must believe health care workers are working hard to get it where it needs to be—in the arms of people. We must continue to celebrate our health care workers who continue to fight against this virus and those who deliver the needed materials to bring all of us continued health and renewed life.

In that regard, our Church Leaders continue to consult with our UCC Wisconsin Conference and the Wisconsin Council of Churches as to putting together a plan for regathering. Last month, Pastor Rich and Jenny attended an online conference entitled "Returning to Church 2.0" put on by the Wisconsin Council of Churches. The information received was brought to our Church and Ministry Team to review. This conference gave guidelines that we hope to use to aid in our planning for regathering. The Council recommended that two main criteria guide our decision-making: (1) Vaccination Rates and (2) Rates of Positive Tests for COVID. The criteria for a "safe" re-gathering involves waiting to regather until vaccination rates have hit 50-70% and when cases are less than 5 per 100,000 population and positive tests less than 10%. Once these criteria have been met, they recommend a slow re-gathering with agreed safeguards in place and a back-up plan in case any cases arise within the gathered community.

All that being said, the guidelines for re-entry will continue to be examined and, hopefully, a plan will emerge which will protect participants when it is safe to re-enter. In the meantime, keep the faith and know the church remains resilient. Immanuel continues to be especially resilient as it is blessed with a spiritually, inspired staff, engaged volunteers and a congregation that participates and supports when the opportunities arise.

The business of the church continues. Virtual services are held. Pastoral care is ongoing. The office is open. Members drop in to conduct business. Groups utilize our larger spaces to hold physically safe meeting. The structure is maintained and improved. The Finance Committee with the help of the Treasurer and Financial Secretary oversees the business of Immanuel. And, at long last it looks like the claim for the water damage the church received in past years due a compromised storm drain (not our fault) has been paid out! We continue to move toward our spring.

Please know even though the snows continue to fall, we are inching toward our own Immanuel spring.
