An update from Immanuel's Lay Leadership

March Journey Connection

Greetings from Immanuel's leadership team. As I said last month spring is in the air. And, as winter retreats life Is returning to the land. Not only is life returning, but hope is returning as COVID numbers fall, vaccination options increase and the number of people vaccinated continues to rise. Hope now is in the air. With all this in mind the work of Immanuel continues. Plans are being made for a long-delayed Spring Annual Meeting in order for the congregation to attend to necessary church business. This meeting will be conducted using a virtual format in order to keep participants safe. It is an experiment in trying to bring Immanuel's business back to a normal timeline. The delayed items to be considered would include:

- an update on the physical structure
- status on re-entry to worship
- approving the recommended budget for 2021
- receive the 2020 Annual Report
- review Immanuel's financial reports
- act on a plan to secure our finances
- election of deacons and elders

While the list may appear long some of the items are informational. The hiatus in group meetings has resulted in more business items than normal being on the agenda. A number of the financial items need congregational approval so the business of the church can go forward. Also, the terms of a number of consistory members are coming to an end and they must be replaced. The departing members have served during a unique time in church governance. It would be our hope to have all the above items discussed and approved so the new consistory is not faced with a transitional mess. More information on this meeting will be forthcoming.

As my term on Consistory is coming to end this will be my last message to you. A new president must be elected. The two terms, to say the least, have been interesting and challenging. Starting with the conducting of church governance in a normal fashion to having to figure out how to conduct it while keeping all members safe. The staff over this year worked long and hard to keep worship, all areas of faith works, missions and the business of Immanuel moving forward. It was not easy, and the way was not always clear, but they persevered, and we continued. My only hope is that no matter what happened, you recognized that your leadership was trying to do the best for Immanuel by being supportive of all efforts to keep us together and moving forward in difficult times. If there were any failures, it was my fault for not being a better president, for everyone else was working and leading as hard as they could to maintain Immanuel as best as they. I believe Immanuel is in good shape when re-entry to corporate worship takes place. My only regret is I will not be president when that occurs for I feel a great sense of responsibility for leading us into exile from sanctuary worship. Please be aware leadership made that decision for the safety of all. If anyone feels as though leadership has let you down, it was me who let you down and I take full responsibility. My parting wish is we move forward on Immanuel's journey to make all joyful followers of Christ.

JAM Time Resources Happy Easter!

The Easter story can be a bit confusing to young children. If you have walked through store aisles recently, you've seen many reminders that Easter is coming. What isn't so obvious is that, for Christians, Easter is truly the most significant day of the year.

At the store we find:

- baskets and eggs as the symbols of Easter, instead of a cross and an empty tomb
- a bunny that brings candy instead of a Savior who brings life

Is it any wonder that some children are more excited about the coming of the Easter Bunny than about the coming of God's kingdom? We spend many days on egg-coloring and baskets but focus on Jesus Christ's death and resurrection for only one hour on Sunday morning. Many parents, however, are looking for ways to make the true significance of Easter a reality to their children. Well, here's the good news!

Bunnies, eggs, baskets and more can become tools that parents use to bring a greater understanding of the message of Easter. With just a little creativity, all these symbols that often replace the real significance of Easter can be the very things that make the holiday full and rich with spiritual meaning.

Tell the Story of Easter with Eggs

Instead of merely coloring eggs this Easter, why not use the eggs to tell the story of God's love and forgiveness?



 Before you hide the eggs or put them in baskets, encircle each one with a colored strip of paper (or place the strip inside plastic eggs) that tells one small part of the Easter story. When the eggs have been found, the children must unscramble the story and put it in the right order.

- Instead of decorating the eggs with dye, or in addition to dying them, write one attribute of Jesus on each egg. You can do this by writing on the egg with a crayon before you put it in the dye. If you are using plastic eggs, you can write with a permanent marker or paint pen.
- Send kids on a hunt for the eggs that have Jesus' attributes written on them. Instead of just discovering eggs, they will be discovering the wonderful things that make Jesus so special. If the eggs are plastic, fill them with treats to remember how sweet the life of Jesus really is.
- Dye eggs in certain colors and use them to tell the story of salvation.

Teach them about Jesus by talking about what a real Easter Bunny is

Use a rabbit picture, a stuffed bunny or even a real one (if you are adventurous) to teach some of the characteristics of Jesus that we should all try to have. By adding a Bible verse to each quality, you will create a true Easter Bunny.

Real Easter bunnies:

- are white as snow because Jesus takes all sin away (Isaiah 1:18b).
- are gentle, kind-hearted and forgiving (Ephesians 4:32).
- have big ears that are quick to listen (James 1:19).
- have big eyes to look carefully and choose what is good (1 Thessalonians 5:21).
- have no voice for complaining or arguing (Philippians 2:13).
- are quiet in prayer, but hop with thanksgiving and rejoicing (Philippians 4:4-6).
- have big feet to go tell others about Jesus so they can be like Easter bunnies, too (Matthew 28: 19-20).
- eat what is healthy by filling up on God's word every day (Psalm 119:11).

The Easter Story: Defining the Terms

We sometimes forget that our children don't understand everything that is being said and done around them. Often we take for granted that they understand things we have not explained.

The Easter story, while beautiful, can be very confusing to children when we don't take time to simplify the story in a way they can understand. An explanation of some big words can help. For very young children, omitting the harder words all together may reduce confusion.

Explain to your kids what these terms mean:

- Disciples Jesus' closest friends
- Pharisees and religious leaders the people who were not teaching the truth about God
- Arrested Guards took Jesus and would not let him go.
- Sanhedrin or Court Leaders all got together and decided that Jesus should be punished for telling the people that He was God's Son.
- Righteous Jesus told only the truth and did everything God wanted Him to do.
- Condemned to death Rulers announced that Jesus would have to die.
- Crucified They nailed His hands and feet onto a big wooden cross and left Him hanging on it until He died.
- Tomb a special place, like a small cave, where Jesus' body was laid after He died
- Resurrection Even though Jesus had been dead for three days, God made Him come back alive so His friends would know that Jesus really is God's Son.



Dear siblings in Christ,

The sun is shining, the temperatures are rising, the daylight is lengthening and spring is surely on the way! Praise God, from whom these blessings flow! I greet you in a Lenten spirit of longing as we continue to endure this ongoing pandemic. Yet with rising hopes and emerging plans, we begin to set our sights on a time of transitioning to in-person gatherings. Perhaps sometime over the summer months, as vaccinations become widespread and readily available, we will return to our sanctuaries for worship! It is tempting to look at the current data and want to leap too quickly. I urge a little more patience.

Back when Trinn and I were raising teenagers, I always worried a bit about adolescent decision making, especially given the fact that I pushed a few limits in my own coming of age. So, when our teens would head out the door for a night of fun, I told them I loved them and often admonished them by saying, PLEASE STAY MEASURED. Funny how I never thought they heard my words, let alone understood them. But now – as twenty-somethings – they love to tease me about how often I repeated that goofy phrase!



The life of faith invariably invites us to take some big, healthy risks . . . to push the arc of justice a bit further, to launch a radical ministry initiative, to chase a personal dream, to open a brand new chapter in life. If we simply trust that God is with us, we'll be alright, we often reckon. But such decisions are neither foolish impulses nor "blind faith" leaps. They involve some reasoning as well, and a good deal of internal calculating as to the possible rewards and consequences. Look no further than Jesus himself, as he turned resolutely toward Jerusalem and began

his final journey. In an extraordinary act of selfless love, he chose to offer the gift of grace at the expense of his very life. In ways large and small, you and I are invited to share this same selfless love as a gift of grace to the world.

I want to encourage you to continue to "stay measured" when it comes to re-gathering. Despite the encouraging statistics, the news this morning warns us that there is strong potential for another spike in new COVID cases if we choose to ignore the four key protocols: 1) wear masks, 2) stay home when possible, 3) keep 6 feet apart when among people, 4) and regularly wash your hands.

Friends, we are almost there! This is no time to throw in the towels of caution and care. Let's faithfully help bring this yearlong pandemic to an end. And let's continue to offer prayers and support to all who are anxious, isolated, grieving, economically hurting and suffering the ill effects of COVID-19.

Here are some important updates:

- 1. The <u>Wisconsin Department of Health</u> and the <u>Wisconsin</u> <u>Council of Churches</u> continue to guide us in terms of knowing when the time is right for returning to in-person worship gatherings:
 - When vaccination rates are 50% or higher (to date 18% have received at least one dose)
 - When cases are reduced to between 5 and 10 per 100,000 of population (currently the 7-day statewide average is 10.8 but there are several hotspot counties above 20)
 - When positive tests are 10% or lower (now at 2.1% for latest 7-day average)
- 2. Here is very timely and important new information for people fully vaccinated, issued this morning by the <u>Center for Disease Control</u> and <u>Prevention</u> (CDC).
- 3. Many have inquired about **clergy vaccinations**. We have learned today that the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services will

be releasing guidance to clarify that all spiritual care providers, both inside and outside of hospital settings, are eligible to be vaccinated at this time. If your pastoral responsibilities would typically have you visiting the sick or entering medical settings such as hospitals and nursing homes (regardless of their current COVID restrictions), this means you should be eligible. It is recommend you bring an identifier such as a business card, ordination card or bulletin with you to demonstrate your clergy status. It may still be the case that individual agencies or appointment-takers have not gotten the word about this new guidance. Vaccine availability varies from county to county, but this should position clergy in a higher priority group.



4. One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) is our special Lenten offering, which extends relief and support to those who have suffered natural disasters, disease and the devastating effects of hunger, poverty, and the lack of drinking water. I urge you to make a special appeal this

year, in light of the devastating effects of COVID throughout the world, and the particular needs of our sisters and brothers in Texas following severe power outages and pervasive storm related damages. The official date for this offering is this Sunday, but feel free to extend the invitation through Easter.

5. **Powered by Generosity** – the 2020 Wisconsin Conference UCC Annual Meeting will take place virtually during the evenings of May 11-13 and Saturday morning, May 15. A full worship service will also be available to congregations for Sunday, May 16. Look for the Official Call and registration in an email from Annual Meeting Event Planner Katie Komassa this Friday!
