# THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTORAL ASSISTANT/DIRECTOR OF MINISTRIES

Dear Immanuel Church Family and Friends,

Oh, my stars, it's good to be back in worship with so many of you! Praise God from Whom all Blessings flow! As I prayerfully considered thoughts to share with you as we are now one month into this time of regathering, I felt it might be helpful for us all to review some of the insightful messages from the book Ministry Mantras, Language for Cultivating Kingdom Culture, by J.R. Briggs / Bob Hyatt. Our leadership read this several years back and our Consistory, with many new members, will begin studying this again. Our Journey Connection states, we are each considered Ministers of Immanuel and are all on a joyful journey – with Jesus – to disclose His presence in the world and His love for all people. As we continue up the "on ramp", creating our "new normal", I encourage all of you to reflect on how the different concepts below look to you as individuals and ultimately Immanuel as one body of Christ.

- ~ Structure Must Always Submit to Spirit Structures are important, but not as important as what the Spirit wants to do in, among and through you. Make the milk—not the container—the priority in your church.
- ~ Bet the Farm on Discipleship Discipleship is the "irreplaceable and lifelong task of becoming like Jesus by embodying His message. If the gospel is simply "say a prayer and you're all set", then there is no need for discipleship, but if the gospel is inviting people into the Way of Jesus to live into the values of the kingdom of God, then discipleship is absolutely essential to right living.
- ~ **How Matters** Colossians 3:23: Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters.
- ~ Slay the Beast of Ambition Before It Slays You "It turns out that what you really think about Jesus is revealed by what you do after you find out that you don't have to do anything."
- ~ Come As You Are, But Don't Stay As You Are Make Room for Questions and Doubt, but Don't Make a Value out of Not Knowing A true missional community will be filled to the brim with people all over the place in their faith. Our job is to make room for them, their doubts

- and their questions, and appropriately challenge them to doubt their doubts and find the answers.
- ~ In a Family, Presence Is More Important Than Attendance We need one another in the body of Christ. With presence as a higher value than attendance, the focus remains on growing hearts more than on growing numbers.
- ~ If You're Not Hurt, Get off the Bench! This may not be your season to serve. If you come here hurt, burned out and in need of healing, just rest. But at a certain point, it's important to see the church not as simply for yourselves, but for others and for a broken and hurting world; and to find your role in creating the kind of community that you and hurt and broken people need.
- ~ This Community Will Be What You Make It No matter who you are, or what your gifts might be, you play a vital role and bear ultimate responsibility for what the church does or fails to do.
- ~ Everything Is Formation Every choice we make, no matter how small or seemingly inconsequential, is actually another brick in our character formation, another piece of who we are becoming. Actions become habits; habits easily become character; character inevitably becomes destiny.
- ~ Few Things Mess with Your Theology More Than Reading Your Bible Mark Twain said, "It ain't the parts of the Bible that I can't understand that bother me, it's the parts that I do understand" And oftentimes, that's what messes with me the most.
- ~ Disagree Without Disengaging In the end, we believe that our best witness to the world is to be a community who can disagree in love and remain committed to one another not because our political or social views bind us together, but because the expansive and reconciling love of Jesus is at work in all of us.
- ~ Be Missionaries Cleverly Disguised as Good Neighbors When God's people are committed to God's mission for God's glory seven days a week, you've got a church full of missionaries.
- ~ Be a Pipe, Not a Bucket Bucket people tend to hoard what God has poured into them, they play it safe, refuse to take risks, and keep it all to themselves. Pipe people give of themselves freely. They share their time, resources, passions, gifts and experiences with others regularly. Let's us cultivate a community of pipes and celebrate when we see pipes working as pipes should!

~ Church Is Free, but It Ain't Cheap! — While money isn't *the* driving concern of our community, it is part of the overall package of life together and even spiritual growth that we want to see for people as they take ownership of our church, which includes bills and obligations. Even beyond that, we believe that the gospel, in showing us clearly the generosity of God toward us,

has the effect of making us into generous people.

~ The Tomb Is Empty-the Pressure's Off — Be encouraged that at the end of the day you are not called to do great things *for* Jesus; you are called to be faithful as you are *with* God. Therefore, when we are anxious, stressed, discouraged, overwhelmed or worried, may we remember that the pressure is off because of what happened on Easter morning. Do not be afraid. The pressure is off. The tomb is empty. And for that, we can be glad.

I hope some, if not all, of these "mantras" spoke to you in a way that will help guide you on your personal faith journey and strengthen us as a community as we strive to cultivate a "Kingdom Culture" here at Immanuel Church.


Adam Vincent: Graduated from West Bend West; Class of 2021; Will be going to Whitewater.

## SHINE





## INDIA NEWS

As COVID continues to be a real threat for the people in the village of Madhavapatnam, primarily because vaccines are not yet readily available and the new Delta variant is prevalent, we are grateful for the ongoing support we are able to offer this community thanks to the generous financial donations and prayers we have received from so many.

Here are some basic updates...

~ The Marshall School continues to offer virtual learning as the primary method of education, except for our hostel children and those who are not equipped to handle that. Children in the village who either don't have a device to use or internet access receive weekly visits from a staff member who delivers books, worksheets, instruction, etc.





~ Working within the "lockdown" limitations set by the village officials, we are currently trying to get caught up on much needed maintenance projects as funds permit. Doing this now is a win/win scenario...we are able to take care of plumbing, painting, and structural repairs while there are limited students in the buildings, and we are providing jobs to many of the people in this community who are suffering from loss of work due to the coronavirus.









~ The same holds true with the new construction on the Boys Dorm; with only \$8,500 more to go in order to complete this project, our hope and prayer would be to have enough funds to finish before the end of the year. Knowing the positive impact it would have on the families in the village who are currently out of work, and for the benefit of our Hostel program, we pray for this blessing.



~ Our Joyful Journeys India ~ COVID Relief Fund has allowed us the resources to care for our House Pastors, Teachers and General Staff, who in turn have been instrumental in helping deliver food and necessities to those who are suffering immensely, including our "Oldsters".
