A word, or two from our Pastor...

Dear Members and Friends of Immanuel,

In the midst of challenging and stressful times, it is good to recall and treasure the good that occurs, so that we are not overwhelmed by the uncertainty and anxiety that remains. So I would like to recall and treasure a few recent good experiences in the shadowy valleys we all currently traverse:

On September 5th, it was sad to say goodbye to Marlene, yet I am so grateful for the wonderful celebration of her ministry during her last Sunday with us. It was encouraging to hear her speak humbly and passionately about her love for sacred music and her desire for it to spiritually nourish and nurture us in faith. I am sure we will bear the fruit of the seeds she has planted long into our future.

Another example: It was sad to not have our normal Rally Day events (pig roast, J.A.M Time kids singing for us in the sanctuary, tables in the parking lot, etc.), but it was great to actually *have* a Rally Day. (And to have coffee and even ice cream!) Even though the shadow of Covid remains with us, it was encouraging to see so many participate in our ministries. And though we know it will most likely still be some time before everything is in full-form, it is encouraging to see the seeds of new hope and new life planted.

Final example: My previous bloodwork in July had given me some cause for concern with a big jump down in my counts, but my latest draw and evaluation in September has given me another 2-month stretch until the next bloodwork in November. My newest counts were a little bit more like my “normal” low counts which was encouraging. And though I continue to still struggle with energy levels and fatigue, I have (for the most part) been able to establish a rhythm that allows me to keep working as best I can. As always, I’m grateful for your loving and prayerful support. I could not do this without you and I bless and thank God for your faithful love.

During this challenging and stressful time, I encourage you to do the same: Recall and treasure all the good that occurs. Otherwise, it’s easy to be overwhelmed with uncertainty and anxiety. Certainly “the good” is probably nothing like what we’ve experienced in the past, but it is impossible to be grateful and content if we compare this season to “simpler times”. It’s better to seek to give thanks and treasure in our hearts any and all good things that come our way.

I want to make it clear that every decision that is made and every policy that is laid out is thoughtfully and prayerfully discussed and voted on by the Consistory.

Certainly, we look to Pastor Rich and Jenny, as the ones closest to the day-to-day goings-on, for input on how to move forward. But the ultimate burden of deciding what's best for Immanuel, COVID or no COVID, lies squarely on the shoulders of Consistory. We as lay leaders are committed to making the best possible decisions to ensure that Immanuel continues to move forward toward being able to do all the things our church loves to do.

We all have our own personal feelings about this pandemic and everything that goes along with it. We just need to remember that as brothers and sisters in Christ, it's His love and the love and compassion we demonstrate to each other and the wider community that make our church what it is. It's that same love and understanding that will keep our church family moving toward the blessings of normalcy that we all hope and pray will come soon.

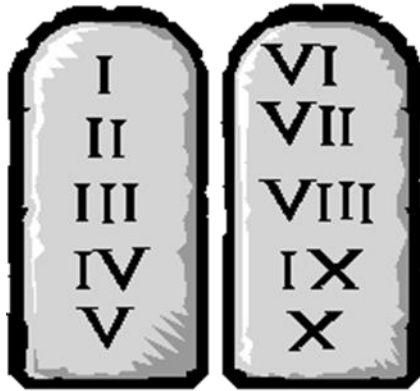
