## What comes after Ordination...

**Greetings Immanuel Family** 

Words cannot express my gratitude for this congregation and the support that you have all shown me through the years. Having been a member since I was 2 years old, I have experienced the joys of JAM Time, Confirmation, and Youth Group. I have participated in ushering, greeting, sound tech, and youth choir. Through the Joyful Journey's Ministry came the birth of "Made with Love" by the Landowgals and our deep relationship with the India Ministry. Since I was 9 years old, I have felt called to some kind of ministry. This congregation has always affirmed and supported that call as I went through discernment, education, and ministerial internships. You hosted me as an intern during my senior year of college and called me back to fill in for three months during a time of sabbatical for Pastor Rich. "Thank you" feels inadequate for how you have been a part of my life and calling. I am humbled and honored to have been a Member in Discernment with this congregation and I'm excited to have been ordained into the UCC in this space. Although my ministry is calling me to new places and my membership may change, this congregation will always be the roots that have grounded me and will give me strength as I grow. My calling currently has me at Columbia St. Mary's in Ozaukee County where I serve as their primary chaplain. Because I have not been called into a church context, I have entered what is called a four-way covenant (which you may understand from your relationship with Rev. Jim Schleif.

This covenant is between myself, the Southeast UCC Association, Columbia St. Mary's Hospital in Ozaukee County, and Plymouth UCC in Milwaukee. Nick and I will of course come back to visit Immanuel as we are able.

#### Where is Mike and Teri?

When we first walked into Immanuel UCC nine years ago, it was to find a location to teach a ballroom dance workshop as a fund-raiser for a Christian humanitarian organization in Nicaragua. Terri Tybring and Pastor Rich were very gracious and helped us apply to use the church's space for the event. After seeing the wall of children in Madhavapatnam who are sponsored through Joyful Journeys, though, we decided to use the proceeds for that ministry instead. The goal was to sponsor one hostel child for one year with the proceeds from this one event, which was achieved!



During this time, we also attended some services at Immanuel to promote the fund-raiser. After the fund-raiser, Teri and I looked at each other and said, "We really like it here! The people are so nice, and the preaching is just great!" So, we started attending church here regularly, got married here, and before long helped out in small ways, such as ushering and teaching some of the Adult Bible Study sessions. At the time, I was working on a Master's degree in Theological Studies, so Rich gave me the opportunity to get some practice giving sermons when he was on vacation or on sabbatical. The entire time, we continued to be spiritually fed through worshipping the Lord during the services here.

Recently, we visited another church that was in the search process for a new Senior Pastor since their current one is retiring. After attending their service, we had the same reaction as when we first attended Immanuel: "We really like it here! The people are so nice, and service is just great!" After that, I applied for the pastor position and went through the lengthy process of interviewing and presenting a sample sermon to the congregation. On October 24th, the congregation voted to call me to be their next pastor, and we have been attending church there ever since.

The congregation is "New Life Fellowship." It is a small non-denominational congregation in the little town of Randolph, WI, which is near Beaver Dam. After I finish out the semester at the colleges where I am currently teaching, I will become the full-time pastor in January. In the meantime, Teri and I are attending services there, getting to know the people, and I am doing a little bit of preaching as well.

It is interesting how God leads us to where we need to be right now in order to prepare us for what He has in store for us later. Our time at Immanuel has been wonderful, while also preparing us for serving at New Life Fellowship. We want to thank you for your tradition of studying the Word of God, praising the Lord in song, approaching Him in prayer, and serving the greater community here and even beyond the seas so faithfully. You will probably see us occasionally as we are still living in West Bend and are still involved with Joyful Journey's work in India.

In closing, please know that we have loved our time at Immanuel!

# MERRY CHRISTMAS FROM ALL THE JAM TIME SHINE BRITES!

Our gifts to YOU this Christmas season can be found hanging on the Immanuel Christmas tree in the form of "Chrismons," which is a combination of the words "Christ" and "monogram" and means "symbols of Christ." Chrismons are gold and white as white is the liturgical (or Church) color for Christmas and symbolizes that Jesus was pure and perfect. Gold symbolizes His Majesty and Glory. Ideas for fashioning them are developed from early Christian symbols, the Bible and church histories.

On our tree you will find:



A *Five-Pointed Star* represents the five wounds of Jesus on the cross.



The *Lamp* represents that Christians believe Jesus is the Light of the World.



The *Cup* or *Chalice* is a symbol Communion. It also represents God's forgiveness.



The *Angel* reminds Christians of the angels who told the shepherds about the birth of Jesus. It can also represent the second coming of Jesus, which the Bible says will start with an Angel blowing a trumpet.



The **Butterfly** is a symbol for transformation and the immortal soul.



The *Heart* is a symbol of love and reminds Christians that God is love.
