A WORD, OR TWO FROM OUR PASTOR...

Dear Members and Friends of Immanuel,

Epiphany is one of my favorite seasons of the church calendar. During the season of Epiphany we experience anew the radiance of God's glory shining in the person and work of Christ Jesus – a glory so profound that every season and story brings new revelations and dimensions to our understanding. In Jesus's words and actions we see "the face of God" in surprising and substantial ways.

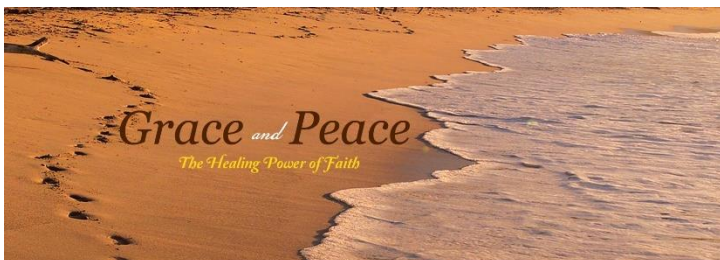
So far in the first four weeks of Epiphany, we've seen Jesus' glory revealed (1) in the Wilderness with John the Baptist, (2) at a Wedding in Cana, (3) at Worship in a Synagogue at his hometown of Nazareth, and (4) at the Workplace of Simon Peter, a fisherman. That's four "W's": Wilderness, Wedding, Worship, Workplace.

God's glory and grace is constant, yet unpredictable. It surprises us in the most obvious of times and places and also at the strangest and most unexpected moments. When we walk by faith, it is not merely worship rituals that provide a window to God's glory in Christ, but also the wonders of nature, the dangers of the desert, the delights of times of celebration, and the rhythms of daily duties. In any of these places (and many more!) the veil between heaven and earth can grow very thin, and the glory of God can be received and experienced anew. Who knows where we will see it next?

May God grant us eyes to see, ears to hear, and hearts to embrace future epiphanies. And may God grant us faith, hope, and love to act upon the ones we've already received.

On behalf of our President...

Recently during worship announcements, Jenny had shared with all of us the guidance from the Wisconsin Council of Churches advising churches to return to virtual worship. With numbers up due to the Omicron variant, the Council was advising this course of action to protect those attendees who might be among the more vulnerable segments of the population. She also shared that the word from the United Church of Christ Southeastern Association was that each church should consider what is best for them. As the lay leadership of Immanuel UCC, we took it upon ourselves to prayerfully consider and discuss the pros and cons of following this direction from the Council.

As has likely since been shared with all our Immanuel UCC family, the decision of Consistory is that for now, Immanuel UCC will stay the course, continuing to meet in-person for Sunday worship, while looking to improve the virtual worship experience for those whose situation makes that a better option. With a couple exceptions, other activities that have begun to re-gather in the past few months will also continue. Our decision rests on a couple of lines of thinking.

Unlike when the decision was made to stop in-person worship and other activities in March of 2020, nothing else in our society is shutting the doors, or showing any inclination of even considering doing so. In March of 2020, everything was stopping. Now, it would only be church that would be missing from the usual, albeit different, normal day-to-day of our world. Now more than ever, we need our spiritual lives at their deepest and richest to help get through these ever-changing and uncertain times.

Secondly, everyone has the freedom to choose how much or little risk they wish to take during this pandemic. We have a strong core of people who have continued to faithfully attend since we first began to regather in June of last year. To shut the door arbitrarily on something they do willingly in faith and are blessed by would not honor the choice they have made to accept the risk that comes with that choice. We all waited a long time to come back together, and despite ongoing risk, we have. Even when Sunday was just Pastor Rich on YouTube, our church thrived when others didn't. Now that we've come back, and stayed back, falling back seems the last thing we should do, for all our sakes.

Again, I can't emphasize enough that these decisions are not made by one person: Pastor Rich, Jenny, or myself. It's all of us on the Consistory that continue to review and evaluate the changing landscape of our world in this pandemic and prayerfully consider the best way forward. For now, that way continues to be...forward.

Immanuel Finance Report

Immanuel's mission "to be and to make Spirit-filled followers of Christ who shine the light of God's love to the world" was advanced in 2021, even with the challenges of COVID-19 still lurking. Preliminary numbers indicate 2021 giving to Immanuel's current expenses of \$330,679. A total of \$328,775 was spent to further this mission: \$134,670 providing meaningful, life-changing worship every week of the year, \$107,050 nurturing persons in their faith journey, and \$87,055 witnessing to our faith in service beyond ourselves. We finished the year \$56,496 under budget and had a net income of \$1,904.

Individual/family 2021 combined contribution statements (showing both Immanuel and Joyful Journeys donations) were made available at church early in January and mailed if not picked up. If you have not yet received your contribution statement, please contact Financial Secretary Cindy Komro at 262.339.0406 or finance@immanuelwestbend.org. Your contribution history is always available online, by signing into your account via the Member Portal link on the Immanuel website. If you haven't yet set up your account, you should use the email listed as the FAMILY email in our records. Any questions should be directed to Cindy Komro.

The Finance Committee encourages everyone to return their 2022 pledge cards, no matter the level of giving. So far, 2022 pledges total \$180,692, while budgeted expenses are \$395,116. Giving envelopes for 2022 are available on the table in front of the church office. Note that due to increased online giving, several members have opted out of receiving envelopes. To save resources, we have reduced our order of envelopes, which naturally results in some of your envelope numbers changing. This trend will likely continue. Property Update...

In the previous Journey Connection, it was mentioned that we had to replace a Power cable on the elevator. Our finance committee approved the proposal for \$10,493 to replace the cable and it was brought forward to Consistory and they approved the proposal to be completed by Otis Elevator. It will be repaired in the coming weeks. That monies will be coming out of the building fund.

In spring we will be bringing forward to the congregation a proposal to replace the roof on the Circle of Friends house. It is way beyond its life expectancy. This will more than likely be a cost of anywhere between \$30,000-\$35,000.

We have to protect our investment so as there will be no further damage, water penetration and animals making their way in to nest etc.

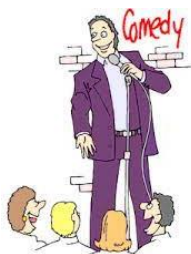

Period Poverty

Period Poverty is a term used to describe inadequate access to period products and the issues that go along with “that time of the month”. Often families are forced to make the hard decisions between putting food on the table or purchasing pads for their daughters; consequently, the absentee rate from school for these young girls is higher because they don’t have the proper protection to allow them to attend. Women who are trying to provide for themselves and their families also can fall into this category; they need feminine hygiene products so they can work, but often it’s in exchange for buying food. The same scenario can also effect adults who suffer from incontinence; purchasing grown-up diapers is not cheap.

Food or personal hygiene protection...it shouldn't have to be a choice.

Why are we bringing this to your attention? Because many of the people we serve at our Circle of Friends Shoppe possibly fall into this category.
