
Mission Statement of Immanuel Church

A WORD, OR TWO FROM OUR PASTOR...

Dear Members and Friends of Immanuel United Church of Christ,

Over the last month our messages have revolved around the theme of renewing our commitment to Christ, one another, and our shared mission. We began with a look at the infant church's four-fold devotion found in Acts 2:42: "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." We followed this up by looking at an apostle's appeal in Hebrews 10:24-25 to the church to maintain the holy habit of gathering together: "And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another." After this we reflected on the importance of godly priorities with Martha and Mary. We will finish this with a look at the hard commitment Ruth makes to Naomi and what it teaches us of God's faithfulness.

It is my prayer that this series has stirred you to renewed commitment, reevaluated priorities, and nurturing holy habits — even when the going is tough.

On the day I wrote this I myself was encouraged anew by the UCC Daily Devotional written by Lillian Daniel. She writes,

The Church, like the rest of society, is still processing the trauma of the last two-plus years of Covid and the growing realization that we cannot go back in time institutionally. When we come back to worship in person and see some empty seats, it's only natural that we miss the people who have not returned. Even happy churches can get grumpy about "Why isn't everyone back yet?" and start to ask, "Who is to blame?"

After encouraging her readers to remain faithful during this difficult time, she concludes by writing,

But if you wonder whether some mythical church down the road is packed, let me tell you: the return is slow across denominations and across the nation. Families with children, stressed to the max during Covid, are the slowest to return to church, and both the mega church and the tiny church are feeling it. If you are getting 30% of your previous in person attendance, that is normal. If you are getting 50%, I'd call that a victory.

We're not anything close to our pre-Covid attendance, but we are certainly around or more than 50%. In any other circumstance, this would be demoralizing. So, it's nice to hear a colleague call this "a victory". Thanks for being part of this "victory" and for maintaining your commitment, participation, presence, support, and service. You are appreciated more than you can know.

Now that we are in the meteorological season of Fall, I've been reflecting upon what it means to me.

First of all, it is my favorite season. I love seeing God's hand in the beautiful picture being painted as I view the changing leaf colors. It is a time of harvest and celebration of thanksgiving for the bounty harvested. In my family of origin, as a child and young adult, it was also celebrations of anniversaries and birthdays. It is also a time of getting ready for winter and anticipation of Advent and the birth of Jesus.

This year, Fall brings both new challenges and meaning for me both personally and as Immanuel's Financial Secretary. It's 2023 Budget time for Immanuel! The time when the Finance Committee will be reflecting upon Immanuel's ministries for the past year(s), what was needed financially to provide for those ministries, and projecting what the 2023 ministries will need financially. These recommendations will be brought to the Consistory and then onto the Congregation.

As of August 31st, 2022, our YTD giving has met 76% of our expenses resulting in a deficit of \$62,465.01.

October starts our discussion on depression and how we can turn to Christ when we are struggling. This topic is not a light one and is one that we will be talking about probably until the start of Advent at the end of November.

As we have done in the past, we will also be taking part in the Out of the Darkness Walk to benefit the American Foundation on Suicide Prevention. This walk is being held this year on October 9th down at Veteran's Park on Milwaukee's Lakefront. As the name says, this raises awareness for suicide prevention and provides resources for those that have been affected by suicide.

There is no fee to be a part of this walk and fundraising is not required. However, I do have a team page set up that, if someone wanted to donate to it, they are more than welcome to. 
