Dear Members and Friends of Immanuel United Church of Christ,

Sometimes in spite of all our best intentions, our meticulous plans, and our careful attention, things still don't turn out as expected. This has certainly proven to be true in regard to my health.

For years, we closely monitored my blood for signs of leukemia in hopes of starting my bone marrow transplant *before* this occurred. But in spite of careful attention, it slipped through and so for the last few weeks I've been on a regimen of chemotherapy. If this takes care of the leukemia, it will probably just be a short time before I move into my bone marrow transplant.

Even though I knew this would eventually be coming, I am surprised by how all this seems to be happening so fast. Not being able to plan anything with certainty in the near future has been heartbreaking. (Not that I enjoy planning *per se*, but the fact that the future is not open to me anymore is sad, particularly with the holidays approaching.)

Thankfully, we've been in discussions with Jane Anderson, our Southeast Association Minister, and she has set us up with great candidates to fill the pulpit for the weeks that I am away for my procedure. We are very pleased with who is available to fill in and we'll let you know more about them as the date approaches. For now, I hope to continue to fulfill my duties as long as I possibly can.

As always, thanks for your generous support, loving concern, and faithful presence. Even when things don't turn out as expected or our plans are rudely disrupted, this one truth remains sure: God is with us, for us, and at work within us. May God's presence, peace, and power be yours.

As I write this on a cloudy, 45-degree Friday afternoon, it's stunning how fast things can change. Three days ago, it was a sunny 70-degree day. We must never forget that, and we must carry on, as we have done despite countless painful things our church family has experienced over not only this year, but the last several.

In many ways one might say we've been a "Job church," experiencing hardships, struggles, and losses that seem to come one after the other after the other. If the Job comparison resonates in those things, however, I encourage and challenge all of us at Immanuel to keep faith, so that when all is said and done, the Job comparison resonates just as strongly that through it all, we remained faithful. Because in the end, when Rich is back up there on Sunday mornings, healthy and strong, just as Job was even more richly blessed than before all his trials, so too will we be.
